Lesson 1: Career Opportunities in Art and Craft

Fine artist: Creates artworks using different techniques and materials such as glass artist, sand artist, sugar artist and sells them to get income.

Art teacher: A person who is professionally trained to actively engage learners to discover and develop their artistic talents.

Animator: Is a creative professional who designs and creates moving images known as animations. Animators work in the following industry: television, film, Games and video production.

Interior designer: Designs and creates interiors as per the wishes of clients the designer earns living from the designs made for interior decorations.

Photographer: Captures images and documents events using a camera and uses them to tell stories. The stories can be published in newspapers or books.

Fashion Designer: Creatively designs clothing accessories and other wearable art and assists in their production.

Curator: Responsible for collecting, cataloguing, organizing and displaying artworks in galleries or museums.

Ceramicist: Uses clay to create objects in pottery ceramics.

Painter: Creates artworks by applying paint on a surface to create images. The painter earns his living by selling the paintings.

Sculptor: Creates three dimensional forms using metals, stone, clay, wood and paper. Earns living through commissions to create the sculptures or sells them to clients.

Art dealer: Buys and sells artworks such as paintings, drawings, sculptures and earns his living

Art Illustrator: Creates two dimensional images and artwork based on briefs for books, cards, magazines and clothes.

Architect: A professional who designs buildings, bridges, stadia and other complex installations.

Web designer: A person who creates a design and layout of a website or web pages. The web designer focuses on visual aspects of the site.

Art director: Manages a visual aspect of a project such as a publication, campaign or film. The director determines which photographs or other design elements are to be used.
